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Letter from the General Secretary

Dear Supporters of the St Austell Festival,

I have pleasure in sending you the syllabus for our 2023 festival. This year we are delighted to welcome **Ann Bauer** as our adjudicator for the Spoken Word. Ann is an old friend of the festival, and she was last with us in 2017. We shall also be delighted to welcome **Elizabeth Childs** to adjudicate Music; she is an adjudicator for the British and International Federation of Festivals, as is Ann, and she will be visiting us for the first time. Elizabeth is a very experienced adjudicator who has been highly recommended to us.

In the <u>Spoken Word</u>, for primary school age classes we have limited the set poems to ones that can be found in only three anthologies. Our Spoken Word Secretary will have been sure to let schools know what these are well before the end of the Summer Term so that they can get them in good time if they will need them. You will find that most of the poems are also available online. An exciting addition to the Spoken Word this year is Class 16; Foundation and Key Stage1 Choral Speaking! Key Stage 2 Choral Speaking has long been a highlight of the festival and we thought we should let the younger children get in on the act! We are still very keen to encourage more junior drama. We know that it is going on in schools, so do enter a group from your school! Our audience will enjoy drama and so will those taking part!

Secondary drama classes have always been non-competitive and since 2013, instead of setting specific classes, we have invited drama teachers to bring students to present their work to be professionally assessed by our adjudicator according to their own criteria and requirements. We want to encourage more drama from secondary school individuals and groups - please make the most of this excellent opportunity to have your work performed in public and be assessed by a professional adjudicator! There will also be two **Secondary poetry classes** -one for humorous poems and one for poems that are not humorous.

In <u>Music</u> there are few changes from last year when several classes were amalgamated as a result of the effects of the pandemic. Music teachers have often found that now there is sadly less time for Music in the curriculum, but they are working hard to re-establish their subject and we wish them well. We hope that things will gradually improve again in future, but for the time being we are keeping classes as they were last year. One new Music class this year is Class 16. This will be an opportunity for young people under 18 years to sing a popular song to a backing track.

Adult Participation

I want to remind you that we welcome adult performers in the Music Section. When you read the syllabus, you will find that there is at least one open class for singers and most instruments, numerous opportunities for adult choirs and smaller groups of singers as well as instrumental ensembles.

Composition classes

Once again, I should also like to draw your attention to two composition classes; one is for a song sung by the composer (Class 35) and the other is for a composition by a young composer (Class 139). Composition is now an important part of both GCSE and A Level Music, so this is an excellent opportunity for students to perform publicly, benefit from the advice of a professional adjudicator and so enhance their examination performance.

Accompanists

We welcome with gratitude our official accompanist, Hannah Hawken, once again this year. Please be sure to get in touch with her at least three weeks before the festival if you wish to use her. She will be happy to arrange a rehearsal. The syllabus indicates how she can be contacted. We are trying to recruit a second official accompanist, so look out for information that we have succeeded on our website!

We are most grateful to Stephen Watts, who has been one of our accompanists for many years. Stephen has now retired and we thank him most sincerely for his wonderful accompanying in so many festivals.

Entry fees have increased by a small amount so that the festival can continue into the foreseeable future, especially as adopting the Run My Festival programme to enable entries online and assist us with our festival organisation has involved extra costs. However, our fees remain among the lowest charged in the country by festivals affiliated to the British and International Federation of Festivals. Please consider becoming a Friend of the Festival, especially if you have children who will be taking part several times. £15 for a single person or £20 for a couple give you access to all festival sessions, including the concert. Details about how to become a Friend are included in this syllabus.

Gala Concert

Our gala concert will be held once again on the final evening of the festival. We shall begin the concert at the earlier time of 6.00 pm, which will accommodate the younger children and enable families to enjoy other commitments that they might have later in the evening! (There is, of course, so much going on in December!)

Data protection

We have done our best to take account of the data protection regulations. Our syllabus incudes our Privacy Notice and the more detailed Privacy Policy can be found on the Festival website or obtained from the secretary. Our entry forms require you to confirm that you are willing to give the necessary consents for this and our safeguarding policy. Parents or guardians need to do this for young people sixteen or under. Alternately, teachers can confirm that they have received the necessary consents for individual entries. We are very grateful for your co-operation. Please note that if you so not wish the name of a performer to appear in our programmes or the name of a winner to appear on our website or in the local press, you need to let us know at the time of entry. I want to end by thanking those who have offered to join our committee or volunteered to help the festival in other ways. We are grateful that this has meant that our festival continues and look forward to working together to provide this valuable opportunity for local talent to be enjoyed. I also thank our sponsors in 2022 for their support, including St Austell Town Council, Cornwall Council and the Radford Charitable Trust.

The deadline for entries is Friday 20th October. Please do your best to get entries to us on time. It is a complex task to prepare the programmes and this can only be done when we know the nature and number of entries. Details about how to enter, including how to pay our fees are on our How to Enter our Festival on page 11.

I very much look forward to welcoming you to the St Austell Festival in November and December.

How To Enter Our Festival

This information forms part of the rules of our Festival.

Entries should be made using the online RunMyFestival system: a link to this is on our website <u>www.staustellfestival.org</u>

An invoice for the appropriate entry fee will then be emailed to schools or individuals, including the necessary information to allow payment by BACS.

Schools, please remember to fill in a purchase order number because some Multi-Academy Trusts will not pay invoices without this on the invoice sent to them. Please be sure to send remittance advices to the Spoken Word Secretary or the Music Entries Secretary.

All entries should be received by Friday 20th October 2023 at the latest. Please note that late entries may not be accepted.

Fees must be paid at the time of entry or as soon as possible after that, but not later than 20th November 2023. After that date, unpaid entries will not be able to perform.

Please note that we must be able to match your payment with your entry. Please include the entry number on any remittance advice, on the reference for a BACS payment or by written note with any cash/cheque. If we cannot match a payment to your entry it will not be considered a valid entry.

<u>Please note that RunMyFestival must be used, or the Festival's official entry</u> forms, because this is also the means of indicating that the necessary consents have been obtained with regard to Safeguarding and Data <u>Protection.</u>

Festival Trophies and Certificates

All performers will receive a certificate, which will be presented after the completion of their class. Winners of classes and of sections of classes where the entry numbers are very large, will receive a special blue certificate. Participation Certificates will also be awarded in non-competitive classes.

The Festival will award trophies only to overall category individual winners and winners of large group classes such as choral speaking groups, choirs and orchestras.

This Year's Festival Timetable

As result of the continuing effects of the pandemic, we are unable to include an approximate timetable in our syllabus this year. Timetabling will depend on the number of entries received, which is very difficult to predict. We'd love to welcome as many as possible to take part, so do get your entries in by 20th October to help us sort out our timetable! We will put an approximate timetable on our website and our Facebook page as soon as the entries received enable us to do so in order that performers have advance notice of our intentions.

We understand that schools have their own timetable pressures. Please contact either the Music Secretary or Spoken Word Secretary to let them know of any longstanding commitments within the Festival weeks.

Performers will be informed by email of the date and time of their classes once timetabling is finalised.

General Rules

1. Own Choice Classes

- a) A copy of Own Choice **music** or **poetry** must be provided for the Adjudicators. If no music or poems are provided they may, at their discretion, allow the competitor to perform, but no marks will be awarded.
- b) Performers entering Own Choice classes **must** state on their Entry the title and composer (Music), and/or the title and author (Spoken Word).
- c) The quality of choice will be considered by the Adjudicator.
- d) Own Choice **music** or **poetry** must be handed to the clerk 10 minutes before the class begins. (Please avoid photocopies unless it is a musical piece from a larger work, which must be destroyed after the adjudication.)
- e) Own Choice in the syllabus indicates one piece only unless otherwise stated or it states Own Choice Performance.

2. Accompanists

- a) Performers may bring their own accompanist but the services of the Official Accompanist will be available. It may be possible to arrange a rehearsal with the accompanist at the accompanist's discretion.
- b) Performers requiring an official accompanist **in any class** should contact her **at least 3 weeks** before the festival.

3. Graded Music Classes

Performers may only enter once in the Graded Classes for any instrument or piano, and should not have passed any grade higher than the one entered.

4. Performers In All Classes Must Be Amateurs

An amateur is considered to be one who does not derive the main part of their income from that section of the Arts in which they are proposing to take part in the Festival. Exception can be made in classes including groups of more than four instrumental players and for the conductors of groups of performers.

5. Awards

The British and International Federation Standard of marking will be adhered to, i.e.:

75-77	FAIR	A performance limited in its communication
78-80	MODERATE	A performance showing development of technique and/or communication
81-83	MERIT	A capable performance showing some artistic appreciation and/or technical ability
84-86	COMMENDED	A convincing performance technically and artistically
87-89	DISTINCTION	An excellent performance technically and artistically
90+	OUTSTANDING	An exceptional performance, both technically and artistically

The Adjudicator's decision shall be final. Any complaint must be in writing, signed, and handed to the General Secretary.

6. Order of Performance

Performers will appear as printed in the official programme. Exceptions may be made in such circumstances as medical appointments and important school commitments, such as exams.

7. Ages for Classes

Ages in classes linked to school year groups are for the 2023/2024 academic year. Other ages are as on 31st August 2023.

8. Trophies

These must be returned to the festival CLEAN and in good order by **Tuesday 31st October 2023** at the latest. Trophies may be returned via the primary school or directly to the Trophy Secretary, Mrs Pat Harvey at

FAC Offices (55 Victoria Road PL25 4QF or 4/40 Par Green Par PL24 4AF).

Holders are responsible for their safe custody and return.

Trophies will only be awarded to overall winners and winners of large group categories such as choral speaking groups, choirs and orchestras.

9. Admission

Performers will be admitted free during the session in which they are participating. Teachers and Teaching Assistants accompanying school groups when they are performing can also be admitted free.

10. Prescribed Edition

The prescribed edition chosen for the set pieces in the Festival should be used by all the performers.

11. Conductors

A professional may conduct in all choir, orchestra and ensemble classes. All conductors should note that it is not permitted to sing along with their choirs.

12. Membership of Adult Choirs

Members of adult choirs must, if required, prove at least two months' membership prior to the date of the Festival.

13. Performing Only Once in a Class

A performer can only participate once in a class, unless taking part in a group with two or more others. However, an exception can be made in case of sickness in, duets or duologues at the discretion of the Committee.

14. Performing From Memory

Performers in the **Spoken Word** classes must perform **from memory**, unless stated otherwise.

15. Awarding of Trophies and Certificates

80 marks must be achieved before a **Trophy** is awarded. Certificates will be awarded to **ALL** performers.

Only the winner of a class, or sub-section of a class, will have a BLUE certificate, but all those taking part individually will receive a white certificate.

Adjudication sheets and Certificates will be awarded to performers after each adjudication. They will not be sent by post.

16. Late Performers

Performers not present when their names are called forfeit their right to compete unless time can be arranged by the Adjudicator.

17. Very Large Classes

Where, in the opinion of the Committee, classes are too large, they may be divided.

18. Lost Property

The Committee cannot be responsible for any loss of personal belongings, musical instruments etc. during the Festival.

And Last, But Not Least!

- a) <u>Mobile phones</u> must be switched off or turned to silent during Festival sessions.
- b) <u>Audio and Video recording</u> is not permitted during any performance or adjudication.
- c) <u>Photographs</u> are not permitted during performances, adjudications or the awarding of trophies and certificates. An exception may be made for press photographers, who must observe all the usual protocols concerning photographing young people and naming them in media publications. In all cases, permission of responsible teachers, parents and guardians must be obtained in advance.

Reminders For Performers

- Your performance lasts from the time you leave your seat until you return to it. In an own choice item, announce the title clearly and slowly.
- When you have finished, acknowledge the audience and your accompanist, if you are playing or singing.
- Where a time limit is stated, please make every effort to comply with it.
- Please show respect for every performance and performer.

Privacy Notice

The St Austell Festival of Music and Speech is a performing arts organisation run entirely by volunteers and registered with the Charity Commission. **New regulations about data protection came into force on 25th May 2018**. Information such as names, addresses, dates of birth, email addresses and phone numbers can all be described as 'personal data'.

What information do we collect about you?

In our festival organisation we handle personal data regularly through paper entry forms, mailing lists, committee, accompanist and volunteer details, information about sponsors and Friends of the Festival etc. We will only ask for such information as is necessary for the efficient administration of the Festival. We do not ask for 'sensitive personal data' unless there is a legitimate reason for this – for example, where an entrant may need support to participate in a class, or where there is a legal requirement.

How will we use the information about you?

We collect information about you in order to process entry to classes in the Festival and for any other administrative functions of the Festival. Access to this data will be restricted to those personnel who administer the festival. It will be stored on password controlled computers; when hard copies are sometimes used to ease administration, they will be kept in a secure place.

Legal Basis

Personal data will not be collected and processed without your unconditional consent or where there is a legitimate interest.

Access to your data and correction

Everyone has a right to know what personal data we hold about them and, if they request it, to receive a hard copy of this information at any time. This information can be requested from the General Secretary (anne@keast.myzen.co.uk). We want to make sure that the personal data we hold about you is accurate and up to date and all reasonable efforts will be made to ensure this is the case. You may ask us to correct or remove any information you think is inaccurate.

Retention of data

Data may be retained according to the Festival's Data Protection Policy, which may be found on our website or by application to the General Secretary (as above).

Do we share this information with anyone else?

The festival will not pass collected data to any third party unless required to do so by law, but it should be noted that names (only) of competitors will appear in our Festival programmes and the names of class winners will be posted on the website and in the local press. If you do not wish a name to appear in any of these places, this should be made clear at the time of entry.

Child Protection Policy

The British and International Federation of Festivals for Music, Dance and Speech work for amateur festivals everywhere to help create thousands of educational performance opportunities for children and young people each year.

The Federation, and its member Festivals, are committed to ensuring safe environments for children and young people and believe that it is always unacceptable for a child or young person to experience abuse of any kind. We recognise our responsibility to safeguard the welfare of all children and young people, by a commitment to recommend best practice which protects them.

This policy applies to our Board of Trustees, paid staff, Adjudicator members, volunteers, students or anyone working on behalf of the Federation and its member Festivals.

We recognise that:

- the welfare of the child/young person is paramount
- all children, regardless of age, disability, gender, racial heritage, religious belief, sexual orientation or identity, have the right to equal protection from all types of harm or abuse
- working in partnership with children, young people, their parents, carers and other agencies is essential in promoting young people's welfare

The purpose of the policy:

to provide protection for the children and young people who participate in our festivals, including the children of festival members
to provide staff and volunteers with guidance on procedures they should adopt in the event that they suspect a child or young person may be experiencing, or be at risk of, harm We will seek to safeguard children and young people by:

- valuing them, listening to and respecting them
- adopting child protection guidelines through procedures and safe working practice for staff and volunteers
- recruiting staff and volunteers safely, ensuring all necessary checks are made
- sharing information about child protection and safe working practice with children, parents, staff and volunteers
- sharing information about concerns with agencies who need to know, and involving parents and children appropriately
- providing effective management for staff and volunteers through supervision, support and training.

The Federation will review this policy each year in November in line with Safe Network guidance or sooner in light of any changes in legislation or guidance. All changes will be communicated to our member Festivals in time for the start of the new Festival year.

Creating Safer Festivals for Everyone



The Federation and its member Festivals use the following policies and procedures to provide safer festivals for everyone:

- 1. A single, definitive Child Protection Policy adopted by all Federation Festivals.
- 2. One or more designated Festival Safeguarding Officers (FSO) appointed for each Federation Festival:

- 3. Best practice advice in the form of Safe Working Practice leaflet, Festival Child Protection leaflet, and any other guidance produced by the Federation. This advice is supported by support and training for all Festival staff and volunteers. Guidance includes clear reporting procedures for anyone with a concern about a child.
- 4. Appropriate recruitment and induction procedures for all new staff and volunteers responsible for providing safe environments for everyone attending/performing at a Federation Festival.
- 5. All Festival personnel wear a badge to identify their roles. All teachers/parents/guardians/carers are asked to report all incidents of any nature to anyone wearing a Festival badge. All reported incidents will be handled in accordance with the Safe Working Practice and Festival Child Protection best practice advice. In addition, we will ensure the availability of a quiet area / room where concerns can be expressed in private.
- 6. For the duration of a Festival all teachers/parents/guardians/carers are responsible for the continuous care and supervision of their own children/pupils. If they are unable to attend personally, they must delegate their responsibilities to an identified adult and ensure that their children/pupils are aware of the identity and name of the person responsible for their care. This includes supervision throughout all Festival venues, practice and changing areas that may be provided. The Festival cannot take any responsibility for property left unattended.
- 7. We do not permit any unauthorised photography at our Federation Festivals. For further information on what is and is not authorised, please contact the Festival Safeguarding Officer or anyone wearing a festival badge. If any child, young person or parent/carer is concerned about any photography or recording taking place at an event, please contact the Festival Safeguarding Officer, who will be pleased to discuss this matter with you.

- 8. Some children and adults with support needs may need help in order to take part. If this is the case, we ask the responsible teachers/parents/guardians/carers to contact the Festival Organisers prior to arrival. The Festival aims to meet these needs wherever possible but must know beforehand in order to prepare support – or to advise that help cannot be provided on this occasion.
